For children or pregnant women that do not have insurance, CDS works with families to assist them in applying for medical assistance, and also offers a sliding scale discount program for reduced cost or free dental care.

This clinic does not provide emergency medical care. If you have a medical emergency, serious medical condition or injury, call 911 immediately.

A completed written consent form by a parent or guardian is required annually for all children and youth except as provided for under Minnesota's consent law. Consent forms are available in school health offices and at the Wayzata Community Clinic.
