Participants will learn how to reduce lead-time and expedite the Production Preparation Process and review the basic concepts of building quality into processes themselves. Participants will learn the concept of the Production Preparation Process in healthcare and understand how to implement it over the remaining days of the seminar.

Tuesday—Thursday, December 11—13, 2012 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Teams will be formed based on actual design needs at Park Nicollet. Consultants and support staff will be assigned to each team. Each team will work in a Park Nicollet department to analyze the targeted services, review the "7 flows of medicine" and evaluate their status. Team will compile production process lists and determine the essential functions to be improved. They will select key areas of opportunity and develop design ideas for each area and evaluate them as a team using evaluation checklists. Participants will also create mockups to verify the effectiveness and practicality of their ideas. Based on the mockups, the teams will re-review the 7 Flows and to further refine their designs and develop implementation plans.

Friday, December 14, 2012 9 a.m. to Noon

Each team member will participate in the presentation of their team's analyses and design activities. Shingijutsu consultants will offer comments and feedback following each team's presentation. The day will conclude with the presentation of individual certificates and recognition of the teams.
