## School-Based Health Resource Centers

Park Nicollet Foundation, in partnership with Park Nicollet Health Services and area school districts, provides no-fee school-based medical care to children and youth from birth through high school graduation. We have four center locations: Brooklyn Center High School, Burnsville Diamondhead Clinic, Richfield High School and St. Louis Park Central Clinic. Mental health services are provided at three of our school locations through our NOW! (No Obstacles to Well-Being) telemental health program.

Our School-Based Health Resource Centers are strategically located in communities with high need and few health resources available. Our Centers provide care to children throughout the community. We work with the local community to provide this health resource to help families and children overcome the economic, transportation and cultural barriers to accessing health care. The generosity of our donors in 2018 gave children in need the care and support they need to build a healthy and successful future.


## Impact in Schools



### Demographics




#### Age of Patients

### Student Outcomes

A recent CDC task force nationwide study on outcomes of school-based health centers showed the following results:

High school dropout rates decreased on average **29.1%**

Alcohol use decreased on average 14.78%, and drug use decreased on average **27.2%**

Teen pregnancies decreased on average **40%**
