Thanks to the generosity of our donors and volunteers in 2018, Park Nicollet Jane Brattain Breast Center provided breast health care to women throughout our community.

2018 Highlights

Be Pink

- Increased awareness about the importance of screening mammograms and raised more than \$120,000 during our Be Pink Breakfast in Wayzata. More than 290 generous donors, including 8 event sponsors, wore their best pink attire to celebrate and support education, mammograms and diagnostic services for women in need in our local community.
- 21 local business Pink Partners, including Haskell's, McCormick's Irish Pub and Restaurant Wayzata, Jarrod Peterson Real Estate Group, Nothing Bundt Cakes Minnetonka and J. McLaughlin – Galleria Edina, helped raise awareness for our Mammo a-go-go community outreach program during the month of October.
- Partnered with CBS Radio and Buz'n 102.9 for Country 4 a Cause concert, where music fans gathered to hear Seth Ennis, Clare Dunn, Devin Dawson, Jerrod Niemann and David Lee Murphey perform and raise awareness and support for Jane Brattain Breast Center.



Volunteer Services

- 14 volunteers provided more than 917 hours of support to help navigate and assist patients at our breast centers.
- More than 50 volunteers provided their expertise, creativity and support to make our month of October 2018 Be Pink activities a success.

Community Partnerships

- Our Mammo a-go-go mobile mammography outreach program reached under-served communities through 85 community-screening events, where 1,347 women were screened for breast cancer. 116 women were given follow-up diagnostic services and seven women were diagnosed with breast cancer.
- 24 bilingual mammography screening events were held in partnership with Vietnamese, Hmong, Somali and Hispanic communities.



Patient & Family Experience

- Provided patients with extra special comfort and care, including comfortable robes, flowers and items to create a calming environment to ease stress and promote dignity.

Research & Innovation

- Hired a high-risk breast cancer care coordinator to work with genetic counselors to establish guidelines, identify patients at high risk for developing breast cancer, facilitate genetic counseling, provide education, coordinate scheduling appointments and track patient outcomes.
- 3-D mammography screening technology used in the Mammo a-go-go Community Outreach program has reduced the number of women who need follow-up screening and diagnostic services.
- Joined the National Institutes of Health National Cancer Institute randomized breast screening trial that will help researchers learn about the best ways to find breast cancer in women who have no symptoms.
